



Declaration of the 2nd Transnational Meeting of Project Eramus+ "Learning and teaching museums. Training program for volunteers in the Roman Museums"

Lisbon (Portugal) April 1-2, 2019

During the days 1 and 2 of April, 2nd Transnational Meeting of Project Eramus+ "Learning and teaching museums. Training program for volunteers in the Roman Museums" took place in the National Museum of Archeology in Lisbon.

In this meeting, the project coordinator, the Roman Studies Foundation (Spain) as well as the project partners, the National Museum of Roman Art (Mérida, Spain), the Association of Friends of MNAR (Mérida, Spain), the Musei dei Fori Imperiali. Mercati di Traiano (Rome, Italy), as well as the National Museum of Archeology (Lisbon, Portugal), participated.

During the first session, Dr. Luís Raposo, President of ICOM-Europe, intervened. He complemented the meeting with a general vision around "Community Involvement in Museums".

The agreements taken at that meeting:

- 1. Promoting the joint work of the partner institutions in the achievement of the objectives of the project.
- 2. Implementing the profile evaluation proposal of the cultural volunteer groups of the three museums attached to the project, provided by the collaborators of the Autonomous University of Madrid.
- 3. Working about the definition of good practice criteria in the training and development work of cultural volunteers in the Museums.
- 4. To advance in the definition of the objectives of the evaluation of the training programs for volunteers, which will be established at the next meeting in Rome.
- 5. To approve the corporate image that will represent the Project during its development as well as to promote the development of a web that gives visibility to it.

On the other hand, during this 2nd Meeting, the partners were summoned to a next meeting in the Musei dei Fori Imperiali, Mercati di Traiano (Rome, Italy), for June 2019.

In this meeting the following aspects will be discussed:

- Definition of the volunteer profile of the Lisbon and Rome cases.
- Establishment of a work schedule for the next evaluation phase.
- Strengthen the joint communication of the institutions involved in the project.
